RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING ONE OR MORE LOANS UNDER ONE OR MORE LOAN AGREEMENTS BETWEEN BLOUNT COUNTY, TENNESSEE AND THE PUBLIC BUILDING AUTHORITY OF BLOUNT COUNTY, TENNESSEE IN AN AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF NOT TO EXCEED TEN MILLION DOLLARS (\$10,000,000) AND EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF ONE OR MORE LOAN AGREEMENTS AND OTHER DOCUMENTS RELATING TO SAID BORROWING; PROVIDING FOR THE APPLICATION OF THE PROCEEDS OF SAID BORROWING AND THE PAYMENT OF THE COUNTY'S OBLIGATIONS UNDER THE LOAN AGREEMENTS; CONSENTING TO THE ASSIGNMENT OF THE COUNTY'S OBLIGATIONS UNDER THE LOAN AGREEMENTS; AND APPROVING ONE OR MORE SWAP AGREEMENTS.

WHEREAS, counties in the State of Tennessee are authorized to finance certain public works projects by the issuance of bonds, notes or other obligations; and

WHEREAS, it has heretofore been determined by the Board of County Commissioners of Blount County, Tennessee (the "County") to be in the best interest of the County to finance (i) acquisition, construction, improvement, renovation, repair and equipping of schools; (ii) payment of funds to the Cities of Alcoa and Maryville to be used for capital improvements to the educational facilities of their respective school systems; (iii) acquisition, construction, improvement, renovation, repair and equipping of the courthouse, the juvenile center and other public buildings; (iv) construction, improvement, paving, equipping and repair of streets, bridges and roads; (v) acquisition of equipment and vehicles for the public safety and public works departments; (vi) acquisition of all property, real and personal, appurtenant thereto; (vii) payment of legal, fiscal, administrative, architectural and engineering costs incident thereto; and (viii) payment of capitalized interest during construction and for up to six months thereafter (collectively, the "Projects"), and the payments of costs of issuance and sale of the Bonds (as defined below) and the Loan Agreements (as defined below); and

WHEREAS, it has been determined to be in the best interest of the County to finance, through a program known as the Tennessee Local Government Alternative Loan Program (TN-LOANSSM) underwritten by Cumberland Securities, Division of Morgan Keegan & Company, Inc., (the "Underwriter") the Projects through the issuance by The Public Building Authority of Blount County, Tennessee (the "Authority") of its Local Government Public Improvement Bonds (the "Bonds") in one or more series (each, a "Series") in the aggregate principal amount of not to exceed \$10,000,000 and the loan of the proceeds thereof to the County pursuant to one or more loan agreements between the Authority and the County (the "Loan Agreements"); and

WHEREAS, an initial resolution proposing loans from the Authority in a principal amount not to exceed \$10,000,000, the proceeds of which shall be used for the purposes hereinabove set forth, has been adopted and together with the notice required by Sections 12-10-115 and 9-21-206, Tennessee Code Annotated, will be published as required by law; and

WHEREAS, the Bonds are to be secured by and contain such terms and provisions as are set forth in an Indenture of Trust, as supplemented (the "Indenture") entered into between the Authority and Regions Bank, an Alabama state bank, as trustee or such other trustee designated by the Authority; and

WHEREAS, subject to compliance with applicable provisions of Tennessee law and the guidelines of the Funding Board (the "Funding Board") of the State of Tennessee, the County and/or the Authority upon approval of the County may enter into one or more Swap Agreements with respect to a Loan Agreement and/or a related Series of Bonds; and

WHEREAS, there has been presented to this meeting the form of the Loan Agreement, which appears to be in appropriate form and is an appropriate instrument to be executed and delivered for the

purposes intended and the form of the following documents: (1) International Swap Dealers Association, Inc. (“ISDA”) Master Agreement; (2) Schedule to Master Agreement; (3) Confirmation for a rate swap transaction; (4) ISDA Credit Support Annex; (5) Financial Guaranty Insurance Policy for Swap Agreement; and (6) Financial Guaranty Insurance Policy for Swap Agreement (Counterparty Payment Policy) (collectively, a “Swap Agreement”); and

WHEREAS, for the purposes of authorizing one or more loans from the Authority, the execution and delivery of one or more Loan Agreements by the County, the pledging of the County’s full faith and credit for the payment of its obligations under each Loan Agreement, approving the assignment of such pledge to secure each related Series of Bonds, and authorizing the execution of such documents and certificates as shall be necessary to consummate the sale and delivery of each Series of Bonds, and approving the terms and condition of one or more Swap Agreements, the Board of County Commissioners of the County adopts this Resolution.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Blount County, Tennessee, as follows:

Section 1. Approval of Loans. For the purpose of providing funds to finance the costs of the Projects, including the payment of costs incident to the issuance and sale of each Series of Bonds and each related Loan Agreement, and making and receiving the loans herein authorized, there is hereby authorized one or more loans (each, a “Loan”) from the Authority in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$10,000,000. Each Series of Bonds may be issued initially either as variable rate bonds with the interest rate established either daily, weekly or short-term period (the “Daily Rate”, “Weekly Rate” and “Short-Term Period”, respectively, as defined in the Loan Agreement) at the then market rate for obligations with

similar credit quality or at a Medium Term Rate (as defined in the Loan Agreement) if the County or the Authority at the direction of the County enters into a Swap Agreement within 365 days of issuance of a Series of Bonds with respect to all or a portion of a Series of Bonds providing for a variable rate to be paid by the Authority resulting in variable rate payments substantially similar to an interest rate established daily, weekly or short-term and fixed payments to be made by the Counterparty (as defined in the Loan Agreement) in the manner set forth in Section 6 herein or in any resolution subsequently adopted and as authorized by law, all as provided in the Indenture and the Loan Agreement. The County shall make payments of interest in the amounts and on the dates as set forth in each Loan Agreement and the Indenture, at a rate or rates not in excess of the maximum rate of interest permitted by applicable law. Each Loan shall be payable as to principal over a period not to exceed thirty-five (35) years from the date of execution of each Loan Agreement. The final dates, original interest rate mode (as set forth above), and amortization of principal amounts of each Loan may be established by the County Executive as shall be determined by the County Executive to be in the best interests of the County, in accordance with the terms of this resolution and each Loan Agreement, taking into consideration the present debt structure of the County and projected funds available for payment of debt service.

Section 2. Interest Rate Conversion. At any time while any Loan remains outstanding, each Loan and the Series of Bonds issued in connection therewith, may, in whole or in part, to the extent permitted by applicable law, be converted from a Daily Rate, Weekly Rate, Short-Term Rate or Medium-Term Rate to the other interest rate periods permitted and as provided in each related Loan Agreement and in the Indenture (which conversion may include such put features relative to any Series of the Bonds as the

Indenture may permit) at the direction of the County Executive and County Clerk and no further action shall be required by the Board of Commissioners.

Section 3. Approval of Loan Agreements. The form, terms and provisions of each Loan Agreement which have been presented at this meeting are hereby approved and the County Executive and County Clerk are hereby authorized, empowered and directed to execute and deliver each Loan Agreement in the name and on behalf of the County. Each Loan Agreement is to be in substantially the form now before this meeting and hereby approved, or with such changes therein as shall be approved by the County Executive and the County Clerk, their execution thereof to constitute conclusive evidence of their approval of any and all changes or revisions therein. From and after the execution and delivery of each Loan Agreement, the County Executive and County Clerk are hereby authorized, empowered and directed to do all such acts and things and to execute all such documents as may be necessary to carry out and comply with the provisions of each Loan Agreement as executed.

To the extent any Loan Agreement can be designated as a "qualified tax-exempt obligation" pursuant to Section 265 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, it shall be so designated in the Loan Agreement by the County Executive and the County Clerk.

Section 4. Pledge of Taxes. The County hereby covenants and agrees, through its governing body, to annually levy and collect a tax upon all taxable property within the County, in addition to all other taxes authorized by law, sufficient to pay when due the annual amounts payable by the County under each Loan Agreement as and when they become due and payable and to pay any expenses of maintaining and operating the Projects required to be paid by the County under the terms of each Loan Agreement and, for such purposes, the County hereby pledges such tax and the full faith and credit of the County to such

payments, provided, however, that the tax hereinabove described will not be required to be levied or, if levied, may be proportionately reduced to the extent of funds appropriated by the governing body of the County to the payment of the amounts described above from other revenues of the County. Such tax, to the extent levied, shall be assessed, levied, collected and paid in like manner as other taxes of the County. Such tax shall not be included within any statutory or other limitation of rate or amount for the County but shall be excluded therefrom and be in addition thereto and in excess thereof, notwithstanding and without regard to the prohibitions, restrictions or requirements of any other law, whether public or private. Any amounts payable under each Loan Agreement falling due at any time when there are insufficient funds from the tax levy on hand shall be paid from current funds of the County and reimbursement therefore should be made out of the taxes hereby provided to be levied when the same shall have been collected.

Section 5. Approval of Bonds. For the purpose of providing funds to make each Loan to the County, as provided herein and in each Loan Agreement, and to pay legal, fiscal, and administrative costs incident thereto including costs incident to the issuance and sale of each Series of Bonds related to a Loan Agreement, the issuance and sale of each Series of Bonds by the Authority in connection with a Loan Agreement is hereby approved.

Section 6. Approval of Swap Agreements. Subject to compliance with the applicable provisions of the laws of the State of Tennessee, the guidelines of the Funding Board, and receipt of the report of the State Director of Local Finance, the County hereby authorizes and approves the entering into and the execution and delivery by the County and/or the Authority of one or more Swap Agreements in connection with all or any portion of any Loan Agreement or related Series of Bonds, as such term is defined in the Indenture, in substantially the form of the International Swap Dealers Association, Inc. Swap Agreement,

the form of which is presented to this meeting, with one or more financial institutions whose debt or claims-paying ability is rated, or is, collateralized, guaranteed or insured by an entity whose debt or claims-paying ability is rated "A" or better by Standard & Poor's or Moody's Investors Service (the "Swap Counterparty") in a notional amount which in the aggregate does not to exceed \$10,000,000 declining in accordance with the amortization schedule for such Series of Bonds and each Loan Agreement relating to such Series of Bonds, having a term not longer than the final maturity of the Series of Bonds and the Loan Agreement to which it relates, providing for either a fixed rate or a variable rate (in accordance with Section 1 hereof) payable by the Authority, determined by the Chairman or Vice-Chairman of the Authority and either variable rate or fixed rate payments by the Swap Counterparty based on (i) BMA Municipal Swap Index, (ii) the rate on the Series of Bonds to which the Swap Agreement relates (iii) the rate on the Series of Bonds to which the Swap Agreement relates, plus Additional Payments (as defined in the Indenture), (iv) LIBOR or a percentage thereof or (v) such other index or method to be approved by the Chairman or Vice-Chairman of the Authority.

Subject to compliance with the applicable provisions of the laws of the State of Tennessee and the guidelines of the Funding Board and receipt of the report of the State Director of Local Finance, the County Executive and County Clerk on behalf of the Board of County Commissioners are hereby authorized, empowered and directed hereunder to do all such acts and things and to execute all such documents as may be necessary to carry out and comply with the provisions of the Swap Agreement as it relates to a Series of Bonds issued in connection with a Loan Agreement. The execution of the related Loan Agreement and delivery of a certificate, which may be the confirmation of the Swap Agreement, approving the terms and conditions of the Swap Agreement by the County Executive and County Clerk shall constitute conclusive

evidence of their approval of the final terms and conditions of the Swap Agreement and, to the extent permitted by applicable law, no further action shall be required by the Board of County Commissioners.

Section 7. Consent to Assignment. The County hereby consents to the assignment pursuant to the Indenture of all the Authority's right, title and interest under each Loan Agreement as security for the Series of Bonds to which such Loan Agreement relates.

Section 8. Additional Authorizations. All acts and doings of the County Executive and County Clerk of the County and any other representative or officer of the County which are in conformity with the purposes and intent of this Resolution and in furtherance of the issuance and sale of each Series of Bonds and the execution and delivery of each Loan Agreement and each Swap Agreement as set forth herein shall be and the same hereby are in all respects, approved and confirmed.

Section 9. Multiple Borrowings. The Loans authorized in Section 1 hereof, the Loan Agreements authorized in Section 3 hereof and the Bonds approved in Section 5 hereof may be executed and delivered in combination with other Loans, Loan Agreements and Bonds hereafter authorized by the County through the TN-LOANSsm Program.

Section 10. Separability. If any section, paragraph or provision of this Resolution shall be held to be invalid or unenforceable for any reason, the invalidity or unenforceability of such section, paragraph or provision shall not affect any of the remaining provisions of this Resolution.

Section 11. Repeal of Conflicting Resolutions and Effective Date. All other resolutions and orders, or parts thereof, in conflict with the provisions of this Resolution, are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed and this Resolution shall be in immediate effect from and after its adoption.

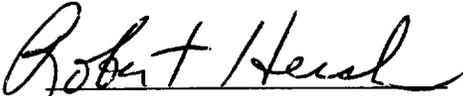

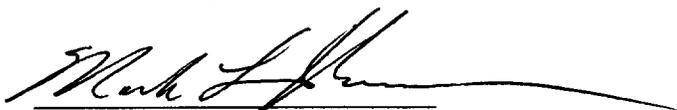

SUBJECT: Indemnity and/or hold harmless contract provisions

At the April 18, 2002, regular monthly meeting of the county commission, contracts for housing juveniles from Jefferson County and from Monroe County in the Blount County Juvenile Detention Center were approved. The commission discussed and recommended that a hold harmless clause for liability be added to each contract subject to my approval.

The Tennessee Attorney General has issued a formal opinion (No. 93-01) which says that a contract provision requiring a local governmental entity to indemnify or hold harmless another governmental entity or a private party beyond the liability imposed upon the governmental entity by law is void and unenforceable because it appropriates public money and nullifies governmental immunity without the authorization of the General Assembly. The opinion further concludes that a local government does not have the power to enter into an indemnity clause which extends its liability beyond that imposed by law because it constitutes an unauthorized, unconstitutional act by the local government.

In the context of the two agreements approved by the county commission and by way of example, if Jefferson County were to agree to indemnify Blount County or hold Blount County harmless for any injury sustained by a Jefferson County juvenile while in custody at the Blount County Juvenile Detention Center, such indemnity agreement would be void and unenforceable according to the Attorney General.

Because of the Attorney General Opinion referenced above, I customarily do not include indemnity and/or hold harmless contract provisions in contracts I prepare for the county, and I recommend that such provisions be removed or limited in contracts I review for the county.

AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is made by and between BLOUNT COUNTY, Tennessee, a political subdivision of the State of Tennessee, (hereinafter "Blount County") and UNION COUNTY, Tennessee, a political subdivision of the State of Tennessee, (hereinafter "Union County").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of Tennessee Code Annotated § § 37-1-116, 37-5-501 and 37-5-510, Blount County operates a juvenile detention center for children (the "Blount County Center"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of Tennessee Code Annotated § 37-1-116(f), Union County desires to contract with Blount County for placement in the Blount County Center of children under the jurisdiction of the juvenile court of Union County.

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the premises and the mutual covenants and agreements herein contained, it is agreed by and between the parties hereto as follows:

1. Subject to the availability of space, Blount County shall provide Union County with detention services and/or temporary holding resource services at the Blount County Center in accordance with law for any child the juvenile court of Union County has ordered be placed into custody at the Blount County Center. While at the Blount County Center, any such child will receive food, shelter and such other physical necessities as may be determined by the director of the center and will be permitted to participate in such educational, recreational and other programs as are offered at the center at that time unless the director determines otherwise.
2. Union County shall be responsible for transporting any such child placed into custody at the Blount County Center to and from the center.
3. Union County shall pay Blount County the sum of \$120.00 dollars per child for each twenty-four (24) hours period or part thereof that such child is in custody at the Blount County Center under the terms of this agreement.
4. The director of the Blount County Center may obtain routine and emergency medical and dental care for any such child placed into custody at the center as determined by the director. Union County shall be responsible for and shall pay for all routine and emergency medical and dental care expenses incurred for the care and treatment of any such child and shall indemnify and hold Blount County harmless therefrom.
5. Blount County shall bill Union County monthly for all charges and expenses owed by Union County for the services rendered at the Blount County

Center under the terms of this agreement. Union County shall pay Blount County for such services within thirty (30) days after being billed therefor. Blount County shall have the right to refuse to provide services at the Blount County Center to Union County if Union County fails to pay for such services within thirty (30) days after being billed therefor.

6. Either party may terminate this agreement by given the other party sixty (60) days written notice thereof, such notice to be sent by first class U.S. Mail, postage prepaid, to the other party's county executive.

7. This agreement has been approved by the county legislative body of each party, and the undersigned representatives have been authorized to execute this agreement on behalf of the respective parties.

8. This agreement shall remain in full force and effect until terminated as provided herein.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties have executed duplicate counterparts of this agreement, each of which may be deemed an original, as of the 8th day of April, 2002.

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of Tennessee Code Annotated § 37-1-116(f), HAMBLEN County desires to contract with Blount County for placement in the Blount County Center of children under the jurisdiction of the juvenile court of HAMBLEN County.

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the premises and the mutual covenants and agreements herein contained, it is agreed by and between the parties hereto as follows:

1. Subject to the availability of space, Blount County shall provide HAMBLEN County with detention services and/or temporary holding resource services at the Blount County Center in accordance with law for any child the juvenile court of HAMBLEN County has ordered be placed into custody at the Blount County Center. While at the Blount County Center, any such child will receive food, shelter and such other physical necessities as may be determined by the director of the center and will be permitted to participate in such educational, recreational and other programs as are offered at the center at that time unless the director determines otherwise.

2. HAMBLEN County shall be responsible for transporting any such child placed into custody at the Blount County Center to and from the center.

3. HAMBLEN County shall pay Blount County the sum of \$120.00 dollars per child for each twenty-four (24) hours period or part thereof that such child is in custody at the Blount County Center under the terms of this agreement.

4. The director of the Blount County Center may obtain routine and emergency medical and dental care for any such child placed into custody at the center as determined by the director. HAMBLEN County shall be responsible for and shall pay for all routine and emergency medical and dental care expenses incurred for the care and treatment of any such child and shall indemnify and hold Blount County harmless therefrom.

5. Blount County shall bill HAMBLEN County monthly for all charges and expenses owed by HAMBLEN County for the services rendered at the Blount County

Center under the terms of this agreement. HAMBLEN County shall pay Blount County for such services within thirty (30) days after being billed therefor. Blount County shall have the right to refuse to provide services at the Blount County Center to HAMBLEN County if HAMBLEN County fails to pay for such services within thirty (30) days after being billed therefor.

6. Either party may terminate this agreement by given the other party sixty (60) days written notice thereof, such notice to be sent by first class U.S. Mail, postage prepaid, to the other party's county executive.

7. This agreement has been approved by the county legislative body of each party, and the undersigned representatives have been authorized to execute this agreement on behalf of the respective parties.

8. This agreement shall remain in full force and effect until terminated as provided herein.

A RESOLUTION AMENDING RESOLUTION NO. 02-02-004 ENTITLED "A RESOLUTION ADOPTING REGULATIONS FOR THE UNINCORPORATED AREAS OF BLOUNT COUNTY PURSUANT TO THE AUTHORITY OF TENNESSEE CODE ANNOTATED SECTIONS 5-1-118© AND 6-2-201(22)."

WHEREAS, on February 21, 2002, the Board of County Commissioners of Blount County, Tennessee, adopted Resolution No. 02-02-004 entitled "A Resolution Adopting Regulations for the Unincorporated Areas of Blount County Pursuant to the Authority of Tennessee Code Annotated Sections 5-1-118 (c) and 6-2-201(22)"; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that it is necessary and proper to amend said Resolution No. 02-02-004 as hereinafter provided.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of Blount County, Tennessee, meeting in regular session assembled this 16th day of May, 2002 as follows:

SECTION 1. Miscellaneous regulations. The following miscellaneous regulations are hereby added to Section 2 of Resolution No. 02-02-004 and adopted for the unincorporated areas of Blount County, to wit:

Regulation No. 46. No sale or distribution of beer without identification. No person shall sell or distribute beer pursuant to a permit issued by the Blount County Beer Committee unless that person shall have had produced to him/her a facially valid picture identification document issued by a state or the Federal government, or an agency thereof, showing that the prospective purchaser or distributee of the beer is not less than twenty-one (21) years of age. This regulation shall be mandatory for every sale or distribution of beer and shall apply in all cases regardless of the apparent age of the prospective purchaser or distributee.

Regulation No. 47. Signs required. No person shall engage in selling or distributing beer pursuant to a permit issued by the Blount County Beer Committee unless signs not less than six (6) inches in height and ten (10) inches in width are prominently displayed at the entrance to or on the front door of the location or building where such sale or distribution of beer will take place and at the point within such location or building where the beer is displayed for sale or distribution, which provide as follows:

Any person less than twenty-one (21) years of age attempting to purchase or obtain beer will be prosecuted to the fullest extent of the law.

SECTION 2. Penalty The wording "fifty dollars (\$50.00)" is hereby deleted from Section 4 of Resolution No. 02-02-004, and the wording "ten dollars (\$10.00)" is substituted in lieu thereof.

SECTION 3. Initiation of Proceedings. A new subsection (6) is added to Section 5 of Resolution 02-02-004 as follows:

(6) The fine for a first offender shall be ten dollars (\$10.00). A first offender may, with the approval of the court, submit such fine to the clerk of the court prior to the time set for the first offender to appear to answer the violation charged, and in such event, the costs may be suspended by the court.

Old subsection (6) of said Section 5 of Resolution No. 02-02-004 is renumbered as new subsection (7).

SECTION 4. Effective date. This resolution shall take effect upon its adoption, the public welfare requiring it.

The County appealed the Chancellor's ruling on April 26, 2002 for the following reasons:

First and foremost, I am still acting on the Commission's directive (by a vote of 17-2), which stated your support of the Local Government Planning Advisory Committee's (LGPAC) decision to remove the Airport from Alcoa's Urban Growth Boundary. In order to pursue this, the County had to appeal or be left out of the proceedings because the Airport Authority had already appealed. Our appeal will allow us to argue our position that the Airport does not meet the definition of an urban growth boundary, which is territory containing high density commercial, industrial and/or residential development.

Secondly, the state law which prevents the airport from being annexed, except by agreement of the Airport Authority, is good for the County because it ensures we will keep our sales tax dollars. However, this law does not protect the County, if in the future the Airport Authority and Alcoa agree on the point of annexation. As long as the Airport remains in a planned growth area, there can be no annexation.

This item is on the May 16 agenda to allow the Commission to give me direction regarding the appeal. If the majority wishes to drop the appeal, I will do that. If the majority would like to continue, we will do that.

For your information, the cost of filing the appeal is \$115 for attorney fees.

**Memorandum of Understanding
Between
The United States Department of the Interior,

This Agreement is entered into by and between the United States Department of Interior, National Park Service, acting through the Superintendent of the Great Smoky Mountains National Park (herein referred to as “Park”) and the Gateway Communities of Townsend, Blount County and Tuckaleechee Cove (hereinafter referred to as “Gateway Communities”) acting through the Mayor of Townsend, County Executive for Blount County, Chair of the Tuckaleechee Cove Advisory Board (TCAB).

ARTICLE I. BACKGROUND AND OBJECTIVES

Great Smoky Mountains National Park, Knoxville Regional Transportation Planning Organization (TPO), and the Gateway Communities of Townsend, Tuckaleechee Cove and Blount County share a mutual interest in traffic congestion, visitor experience, and resource protection issues affecting Great Smoky Mountains National Park and their communities.

Visitation to the Cove has grown approximately 300% in the last 20 years. It is now one of the most visited areas in the National Park system. With over 2 million annual visitors, traffic management is one of the Cove’s most pressing issues and current congestion levels underscore the importance of developing successful management strategies. Townsend, Tuckaleechee Cove and Blount County provide primary access to the Cades Cove area of Great Smoky Mountains National Park.

The objective of this Agreement is to promote cooperation between the Park and Gateway Communities on transportation and visitor issues. The vehicle for this cooperation will be the Regional Transportation Alternatives Plan – Gateway Communities Transportation Strategies (hereinafter referred to as Gateway Communities Transportation Strategies). The Gateway Communities Transportation Strategies process will provide a means for public participation in developing alternative transportation and visitor strategies that address traffic congestion, enhance visitor experience and protect resources in the Townsend-Tuckaleechee Cove areas of Blount County.

ARTICLE II – AUTHORITY

The authority for this Agreement is 16 U.S.C.1-1a-2j.

ARTICLE III - STATEMENT OF WORK

A. The Gateway Communities will:

1. Commit to be an active participant in the Gateway Communities Transportation Strategies planning process. This includes participation in charettes, open houses and other public consensus gathering efforts essential to the successful completion of this project
2. The Gateway Communities will select by consensus a nine-member task force. These task force members will provide timely feedback and input on draft reports and participate in charettes, open houses and other public consensus gathering efforts.

B. The Park Service will:

1. Provide consultant support to the Gateway Communities Transportation Strategies planning process through Agreements with the National Park Foundation and Knoxville Regional Transportation Planning Organization.
2. Designate one park representative and one TPO representative to serve as a member of the task force. This task force member will provide timely feedback and input on draft reports, participate in charettes, open houses and other public consensus gathering efforts essential to the successful completion of this project.
3. Provide technical staff support and coordination as appropriate (intra- and inter-agency coordination with other National Park Service efforts within the National Park).

C. The Service, and Gateway Communities agree to:

1. Cooperate to the fullest extent in all activities related to the described work in order to complete a desirable and useful project. The parties will meet to discuss individual actions and assess progress.

ARTICLE IV - TERM OF AGREEMENT

This Agreement will be effective for a period of two years from the date of final signature, unless it is terminated earlier by one of the parties pursuant to Article IX that follows.

ARTICLE VI – PRIOR APPROVAL

The Service shall review and approve intermediate information, draft reports, and partial plans and will approve final documents before final release of study results.

ARTICLE VII – REPORTS AND/OR DELIVERABLES

No products or deliverables are required to fulfill the obligations of this Memorandum of Understanding.

ARTICLE VIII – PROPERTY UTILIZATION

Property furnished by the Federal Government shall be used and disposed of as set forth in NPS Property Management Regulations. Any property furnished by a local

municipality shall be used and disposed of as appropriate consistent with local government procedures.

ARTICLE IX – MODIFICATION AND TERMINATION

Total duration of this Agreement shall not exceed two years from the date of agreement unless the term is extended or otherwise amended. The effective date of this Agreement shall be the date of signing by the last party to sign the Agreement. Either party may terminate this Agreement by providing not less than 60 (sixty) days advance written notice to the other party indicating such an intent.

ARTICLE X - STANDARD CLAUSES

A. Civil Rights

During the performance of this agreement, the participants agree to abide by the terms of USDI-Civil Rights Assurance Certification, non-discrimination and will not discriminate against any person because of race, color, religion, sex or national origin. The participants will take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed without regard to their race, color, religion, sex or national origin.

B. Officials not to Benefit

No member or delegate to Congress, or resident Commissioner, shall be admitted to any share or part of this Agreement, or to any benefit that may arise therefrom, but this provision shall not be construed to extend to this agreement if made with a corporation for its general benefit.

C. Public Information Release

The Gateway Communities must obtain prior NPS approval from the office of the superintendent before releasing any public information, which refers to the Department of the Interior, any bureau or employee (by name or title), or to this Agreement. The specific text, layout, photographs, etc., of the proposed release must be submitted to the office of the superintendent along with the request for approval.

REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION ALTERNATIVES PLAN
GATEWAY COMMUNITIES TRANSPORTATION STRATEGIES

PURPOSE AND FOCUS OF STUDY

The purpose of this planning initiative is to support the development of transportation management strategies for a regional, multi-modal transportation network connecting Great Smoky Mountains National Park (GRSM) and the gateway communities in Blount, Sevier and Cocke counties. Key elements in this process include local community outreach and consensus building efforts that identify common goals, objectives and implementation strategies. Building partnerships and a shared vision among the gateway communities, National Park and adjacent counties are important to the development of a mutually beneficial transportation system, which provides seamless mobility for visitors and residents alike. The Cades Cove Development Concept and Transportation Management Plan process will serve as the umbrella for this next phase in the planning initiative.

BACKGROUND

The Great Smoky Mountains National Park is the most heavily visited national park in the United States. Over 10 million visitors a year traverse park roads to enjoy the beauty and experience the scenic views offered. While visitation has increased 67 percent over last 30 years, the transportation system has remained essentially unaltered. Park visitors increasingly experience gridlock conditions on Park roads, over flowing parking lots and heavily used tourist destinations, all of which are slowly destroying the Park's natural and cultural resources.

Visitation levels have increased notably in Cades Cove over recent years, with an especially dramatic increase since 1990. In 1985, approximately 381,000 vehicles entered Cades Cove during the year. By 1990, that figure had grown to about 394,000. In 1998 over 689,000 vehicles entered the Cove and in 2000 approximately 740,000 vehicles or nearly 2 million visitors experienced the Cove. The 11-mile Loop Road is operating in a near grid lock congestion condition during much of the summer and fall peak visitation periods.

Access to Cades Cove is predominantly by automobile via the gateway communities of Townsend, Gatlinburg and Pigeon Forge. The transportation choices available to the Park in Cades Cove will influence travel patterns within the gateway communities and region. The gateway community nearest to Cades Cove is Townsend. Cades Cove, the most heavily visited attraction in the Park, is most easily accessible from Townsend via Laurel Creek Road, from Pigeon Forge via Highway 321 to Laurel Creek Road and from Gatlinburg via Little River Road/Laurel Creek Road.

The gateway communities of Sevierville, Pigeon Forge, Gatlinburg and Townsend, which were once small rural communities, are now tourist destinations in their own right. As a result of this rapid growth, the gateway communities have been experiencing a tremendous increase in vehicle traffic, approximately 9 percent per year for last several years. In response to this growth in tourism, major roadway improvements have been planned and designed representing an investment of well over a quarter of a billion dollars in the next 10 years. While the surrounding transportation network is increasing in vehicular capacity, Park roads are not. Tourist often traverse the roads between the Park and the gateway communities many times a day during a typical vacation stay. In an effort to protect the quality of our visitors experience, the transportation network serving both the Park and the gateway communities needs to be seamless and provide for smooth transition between the many destinations.

PARTNERS' ROLES

The Knoxville Regional Transportation Planning Organization (TPO) will oversee and participate in the planning initiative. The NPS project manager and transportation planner for the GRSM will actively participate in project management, work sessions, meetings and product review. The NPS Denver Service Center will facilitate the charettes and offer other support as needed. HNTB will be responsible for the balance of work related tasks as identified below in the Scope of Services.

ONGOING PROJECT COORDINATION

Communication and coordination among participating partners (project stakeholders and gateway communities) is important throughout this planning process and will contribute to the success of the project. In part, this communication/coordination effort will be accomplished through active participation in the project management by the NPS in partnership with the TPO. Inclusion of local community leaders and residents in the development of alternatives and approval of plan strategies is essential to successful implementation. The Scope of Work identifies two charette-type work sessions involving Park and TPO staff and community members/stakeholders for the development and review of potential alternatives.

STUDY FOCUS

This project will focus on the Gateway community of Townsend and the surrounding Tuckaleechee Cove area in Blount County. Due to its proximity to Cades Cove, this area would be most directly impacted by any implementation of a transportation strategy for the Cove. The focus of workshops and open houses will be on area needs and the participation of area residents and community leaders will be targeted. Inherent to the success of this planning process is the buy-in from the gateway communities, which potentially could be impacted by the recommendations and alternatives identified in the final document. The scope of work contains several strategies to develop working

partnerships with local community leaders, including gateway community participation in the approval processes from alternative identification to acceptance of the final report.

SCOPE OF SERVICES:

1. Facilitate public participation and inter-governmental collaboration/cooperation and consensus building among project shareholders.

Pre-Kickoff Media Event GRSM, National Park Foundation, Ford Motor Company, TPO Townsend, Tuckaleechee Cove, Blount County, others. April 2002

Tasks:

- Form a task force working group to coordinate with GRSM, TPO and consultants. Review adopted plans, policies and other documents relevant to Townsend and Tuckaleechee Cove.
- Review local demographic, transportation, tourism, economic trends and forecasts for gateway area.
- Develop Power Point presentation that can be expanded at each iterative step of the process.
- Develop Project Notebook for Task deliverables.

Public Outreach:

- TCAB/Townsend City Council/Blount County asked to select participants for task force.
- Task force orientation luncheon.
- Charette – with task force to identify local issues related to Cades Cove initiatives; compatibility of the goals and objectives developed for Cades Cove with established goals and objectives for Tuckaleechee Cove and Townsend.
- Kickoff/Open House – Presentation of issues and concerns identified through Cades Cove public scoping; comparative analysis of the goals and objectives developed for Cades Cove and relationship to goals and objectives for TCAB/Townsend.
- On going public outreach through existing boards, committees, organizations, and task force.

Deliverables:

- Chapter I, Project Notebook – Summary Report of issues and concerns identified through public scoping and comparative analysis of Cades Cove goals and objectives to Tuckaleechee Cove/Townsend's goals and objectives.
- Power Point presentation reflecting work accomplished.
- Open House Feedback Graphic Summarization Exhibit - framework diagram to reflect issues raised by participants.

Objectives 2, 3 and 4 will be completed simultaneously and will generate transportation alternatives, land-use concepts and implementation strategies relevant to Townsend/Tuckaleechee Cove communities. There will be one charette (task force) for presentation

of draft alternatives and one public open house for presentation of draft alternatives. Presentation of the final plan will be made to a joint meeting of the task force, Tuckaleechee Cove Advisory Board, Townsend City Council and Blount County Planning Commission.

2. Identify alternatives that meet local and regional transportation goals and objectives.

Tasks:

- **Transportation Strategies.** Given the alternatives identified for Cades Cove, potential impacts to Townsend and the surrounding Tuckaleechee Cove area will be identified and appropriate transportation alternatives will be developed to address future transportation initiatives proposed by the National Park for Cades Cove.
- On going public outreach through existing boards, committees, organizations, and task force. (TCAB/Townsend City Council updates as appropriate.)

Deliverables:

- Chapter 2, Project Notebook - Technical Memorandum – Alternative Transportation Strategies for Townsend and surrounding Tuckaleechee Cove area.
- Revision to Power Point presentation adding new information related to transportation alternatives.

3. Identify land use concepts necessary to support/facilitate the future development of transportation alternatives.

Tasks:

- **Land Use Strategies.** Given the alternatives identified for Cades Cove, potential impacts to Townsend and the surrounding Tuckaleechee Cove area will be identified and appropriate land use concepts and alternatives will be developed to address future transportation initiatives proposed by the National Park.
- On going public outreach through existing boards, committees, organizations and task force. (TCAB/Townsend City Council updates as appropriate)

Deliverables:

- Chapter 3, Project Notebook - Technical Memorandum – Land Use Potential and Related Strategies for Townsend and surrounding Tuckaleechee Cove area.
- Revision to Power Point presentation adding new information related to land use strategies identified.

4. Identify appropriate, potential mechanism(s) for implementation and operation of a multi-modal transportation system.

Tasks:

- **Implementation Strategies.** Given the alternatives identified for Cades Cove, potential impacts to Townsend and the surrounding Tuckaleechee Cove area will be identified and appropriate implementation strategies will be developed to address future transportation initiatives undertaken by the National Park for Cades Cove.

5. Culmination of the transportation, land use and implementation planning efforts will be presented at a charette and open house to solicit public reaction to the draft alternatives and strategies identified.

Thank you for taking the time out of your busy schedule to advise the Airport Authority about the concerns of the citizens regarding aircraft noise in the communities near McGhee Tyson Airport.

Our staff met with Colonel Richard Poteet, Environmental Safety Officer, Tennessee Air National Guard (TANG), to discuss the problems of military aircraft turning left on departure from Runway 23L over the City of Alcoa. The discussion centered on how to improve communications regarding noise concerns to transient aircraft. Transient aircraft are those who are landing here only for the purpose of obtaining fuel or other short-term activities. These pilots may not be aware of certain noise restrictions or concerns in the immediate vicinity. TANG will issue aviation notices to airmen advising them of the height and turn restrictions in the area. At some time in the near future, permanent changes will be made to flight information advising pilots of these restrictions. Additionally, the Air Traffic Control Tower will be advised of these concerns and asked to reinforce these issues with pilots taking off from McGhee Tyson Airport.

Communications

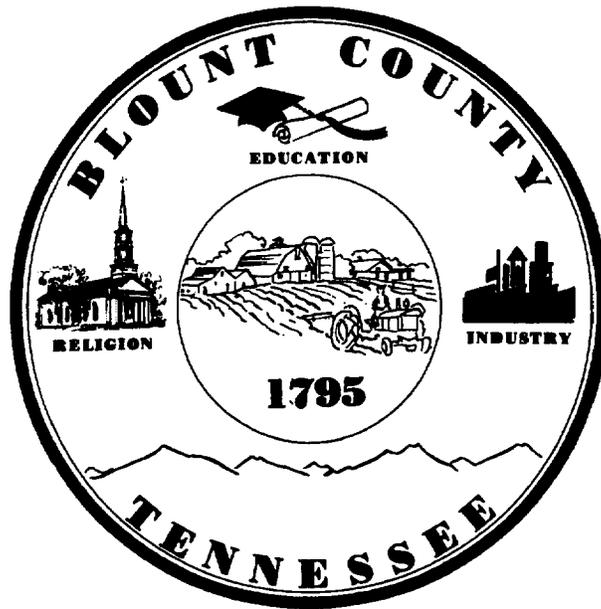
